Who was Assunta Marchetti?

She was born in Lombrici - Camaiore, Italy, on August 15, 1871, and she died in São Paulo (Christopher Columbus orphanage), Vila Prudente, on July 1, 1948. She is the co-founder of the Missionary Sisters of St. Charles Borromeo – Scalabrinians. She dedicated herself especially to the orphans, the migrants, the sick and the helpless.

In the love of the Eucharistic Jesus and the Virgin Mary, she found strength in every moment of her humble and turbulent existence. She served as Superior General, mother of the orphans, a nurse, catechist, a cook in the orphanages and asylums, always “extending her arms to the unhappy and open her hands to the indigents” (cf. Pr 31,20).

HOLINESS LIVED BY BLESSED ASSUNTA

The concept of holiness is complex. The word saint, derived from Latin, refers to a person who is not fully anchored in the reality she inhabits, but is instead oriented toward the Other whom she obeys and who, for her, bears a name: God.

Those recognized by the Catholic Church as saints or blessed - whether formally canonized or not - embody an ideal of the human person understood as a richly complex being, shaped simultaneously by a profound interior life, a singular freedom, and an incomparable dedication to the service of others.

That is why so many saints and blessed whom we know - even those devoted to the contemplative life - showed remarkable creativity in discovering humble and often discreet ways to serve others. Sometimes this meant nothing more than carrying a candle to a sister's room at bedtime or washing the mud-soaked shoes of the sisters returning home exhausted. Mother Assunta, known as the mother of orphans, insisted on personally caring for the destitute who arrived in pitiable condition, even those whose appearance naturally provoked human revulsion.

Through their gestures, these holy men and women make visible the maternal tenderness of God. Holiness generally takes shape in response to the social and cultural demands of the particular time and place in which they live. In this sense, saints can be seen as profoundly “eccentric” beings - persons decentered from themselves and oriented toward others, yet deeply conscious of their own fragility. Precisely in the midst of this constant “being for others,” they tirelessly seek divine assistance through prayer and through an intimate encounter with God.

These were the defining traits of Blessed Assunta Marchetti, a missionary who walked the path of holiness by constantly seeking in God - and especially in the Eucharist, in devotion to the crucified Christ, and in love for the Virgin Mary - the strength to serve orphans, the sick, and migrants with a mother's tenderness. And divine grace never fails. What is required is our willingness to cooperate with it, beginning anew each day and embracing the present moment with love. It is a simple and humble commitment, for we know that our love and charity are never entirely free from traces

of selfishness. Therefore, with humility and trust in redeeming love, let us move forward, following the example of Blessed Assunta, who, in her littleness and simplicity, once wrote: “God makes use of the most unfit, the most inadequate instruments for his works. I have placed all my trust in the sweetest Heart of Jesus” (Circular to the Sisters of the Congregation, 08/09/1927). We too, despite our limitations, can continue confidently toward the goal until God calls us home
